Rome High School is pleased to announce the hiring of Alecia Parker as the new Lady Wolves volleyball coach.

Parker has been on the Rome staff since the 2005-2009 seasons when she served as junior varsity coach. From 2010-2013 she led the Rome Middle School program. In 2014 she returned to Rome High as the junior varsity coach. Prior to coming to Rome, she was head coach of the Dawson County sophomore volleyball squad from 2000-2001.

“We are proud to have Alecia Parker lead our volleyball program. She’s coached the sport at every level for Rome City Schools, she’s known our student-athletes since their days in the middle school, and she will be able to build those relationships into a strong, highly competitive volleyball team,” said Rome Athletic Director Kevin Strickland.
